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TECHNICAL INFORMATION

Designed by Artisan for Natuzzi.

A striking, elliptical-shaped table made entirely of solid wood by expert craftsmen.

Monument table is at the same time a functional furniture piece and a bold sculpture that elevates any space with its simple yet striking presence. Handcrafted from sustainably-sourced wood, the table is both durable and monumental, designed and crafted to withstand the test of time

The uniquely shaped top and legs positioned under different angles make the table look completely different from every angle you look at it.

Exclusive dining table produced for Natuzzi excepted Belgium - Netherlands , France and South Korea.

MATERIALS:

Table with top and base made of solid European walnut wood treated with oil finish to preserve its natural beauty. Due to its natural grain and colors, each piece is to be considered unique.

Wood can change color when exposed to sunlight. Wood being a natural material can react to changing humidity.

Prevention

Daily dust wipe prevents scratches:

Do not forget to clean wooden furniture regularly. Thus, a layer of dust that could later scratch the surface cannot be created at all. The dust layer contains tiny particles that can cause micro scratches. Clean, soft cloths effectively remove dust. The cleaning agent or cloth should be moistened a little so that the dust does not only squeeze, but actually retains it on the cloth.

Then clean with a dry cloth.

Mild soap for dirt:

Usually, you should avoid using soap to clean the wooden surface. Sticky dirt, e.g. on a wooden table, you may need to clean with water and soap. To do this, do as follows: Melt the mild detergent in water. Dip the cleaning cloth, then squeeze it until it almost dries. Clean the caught area and dry it immediately with a clean, soft cloth.

Coasters for heat and dirt protection:

Use coasters for glasses and services on a table of solid wood. These are not only decorative elements, but also protect your wooden tabletop from scratches and hot objects. Liquids and droplets of fat do not even come into contact with the wooden surface. If this happens, simply remove it immediately and dry it. That prevents it from soaking into the table.

Sunlight protection:

Try to find a place for your new wooden furniture that is not exposed to direct sunlight. This will prevent the wooden surface from fading. However, you can not completely prevent mild color changes, because they are a natural part of the aging process of your wooden furniture. For example, cherry wood eventually becomes darker, while the walnut gets a brighter shade. This creates a completely natural, beautiful patina that makes your piece of furniture unique.

Change the decoration position:

Are there candlesticks, vases or fruit bowls on your wooden

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table? Regularly change the position of your decorative objects to avoid creating irregular dark and bright stains.

Things not to do:

Cleaning with microfibre cloths;

Use chemical cleaning agents;

Expose furniture to high temperatures (radiators, furnaces, ventilation openings).

Reparation

Remove larger stains:

Heavier dirt that cannot be removed by simple wipe can be removed from oiled or waxed furniture with fine sanding paper, which is not possible with a lacquered surface. Then the sanded areas are retreated with the appropriate oil or wax. Stains caused by moisture can only be treated after they have completely dried.

Remove scratches:

Scratches on the infused or waxed furniture can be grinded with sanding paper until the scratch is no longer visible. You should sand a large surface around the scratch, so that the color differences are not noticed. Please always work in the direction of age.

Carefully remove the grinding residues and apply the appropriate oil or wax abundantly.

After about 15 minutes, wipe the residue with a cloth that leaves no hair, and then polish.

Remove dents:

Dents can also often be removed from oiled or wavy pieces of furniture. Grind it with sandpaper, put a damp cloth on it and moisten the dent with an iron - the tree swells and the dent disappears. To avoid burn marks, the cloth must be wet enough. Make sure the iron doesn't come into direct contact with the tree! Please apply oil or wax to the affected area as described above only after the affected area has completely dried.

Regular intake to maintain the protective layer:

Untreated wood attracts dirt from the environment like a magnet. Absorbs water and oils, so that it is easy to develop a color change that is difficult to remove. Oiled wooden surfaces represent a natural protective barrier from external influences, and in order to maintain this protective layer, oiled surfaces should be refreshed regularly.

We recommend that wooden surfaces oil at least once every two years. However, this period may also be shorter depending on how it is used. So the dining table will need more frequent refresh than a dresser.
